WOMEN'S COMMISSION Secretary's Report

INTRODUCTION

This paper informs Members of the activities undertaken by the Women's Commission (WoC) and the Women's Division since the 42nd meeting held on 29 May 2007.

ACTIVITIES HELD SINCE THE LAST MEETING

- 2. The activities held since the last meeting are as follows-
 - 29 May 2007

An exchange session with women's groups was held by WoC to gather views from women's groups on the publication project and museum project. The two Co-convenors¹ and two Members² of the Task Force on All-China Women's Federation Projects attended the session. About 36 representatives of women's groups also attended.

• 30 May 2007

Dr Yeung Ka-Ching attended the round-up session with organisations participated in the Kwun Tong District Quality Parenting Pilot Project jointly organised by WoC with the Kwun Tong District Council.

• 31 May 2007

The WoC Chairperson and four WoC Members³ attended a press briefing to share information on Family-friendly Employment Policies and Practices and WoC initiatives.

• 1 June 2007

The Chairperson, the Financial Secretary and the Secretary for Health, Welfare and Food officiated at the Third Graduation Ceremony of Capacity Building Mileage Programme. For the first time Level 5 Certificates were awarded to students. A total of 532 students were awarded certificates of various levels. Dr Yeung Ka-ching also attended the graduation ceremony.

The WoC Chairperson officiated at the Seminar on Family-friendly Employment Practices co-organised by the WoC with the Labour Hong Kong Institute of Human Department, Resources Management, Hong Kong People Management Association and the Hong Kong Council on Social Service. Ms Lau Ka-shi, Co-convenor of the Working Group on Enabling Environment, represented the WoC to deliver a talk on FEPPs at the seminar. The seminar attracted some 350 participants from the business sector and human resources professionals. Ms Ayesha Macpherson and a representative of the WoC Secretariat also attended the seminar.
